

Grant Program Guidelines

Amount to Request:

- Minimum request is \$5,000 for Dublin, Livermore and Pleasanton
- ▶ \$25,000 maximum for Dublin (No maximum for Livermore and Pleasanton).

Grant Program Priorities: Dublin

Dublin Human Services Priorities:

- Focus on critical, or essential needs and services such as food, shelter, health care and less priority on recreation and enrichment programs.
- Findings from the <u>2024 Eastern Alameda County Human Services Needs</u> <u>Assessment</u>:
 - Housing Services
 - Health Care Services
 - Mental Health Services
 - Services Provision, Awareness, and Navigation
 - Racial/Linguistic/Cultural Responsiveness
 - Substance Abuse Services
 - Safety
 - Transportation









Grant Program Priorities: Livermore

Projects that prioritize at least one of the following "Priority Needs":

1) Housing Services

- Affordable housing units for low-income families, people experiencing homelessness, people with disabilities, and seniors
- Rental assistance
- Housing services to keep low-income families, people with disabilities, and seniors housed

3) Health Care Services

- Navigation of mental health services and substance use programs for low-income people, people experiencing homelessness, youth and seniors
- Support services for people with disabilities, seniors, low-income families, and survivors of domestic violence
- Medical and dental services

2) Homeless Services

- Emergency shelter and temporary/transitional housing
- Basic needs such as food services, showers/restrooms and storage
- Employment services
- Supportive services such as service navigation and counseling

4) Service Provision, Awareness, and Navigation

- Food Security
- Access to critical safety net services for non-English speakers, people with disabilities, seniors, low-income families, and youth Access to and navigation of social services and government sponsored programs
- Transportation Services
- Access to programs that promote and support economic stability



Grant Application Process

▶ How to Apply online through ZoomGrants™

- Create a ZoomGrants[™] account (Select the "My Account" tab), if you don't already have one.
- Click the "Apply" button next to the Grant you are applying for.
- 4. Click the "Summary" tab to provide organization and contact information.
- 5. Select the "Application Questions" tab to provide detailed information.
- 6. Complete the "Budget" tab.
- 7. Upload documents by clicking on the "Documents" tab.
- 8. Submit your application!

- 54 Days to Complete Tip: Do Not Wait Until 3:59 p.m.!

New for this Year:

- One application for all three cities!
- Fewer questions for most applications (*Additional questions for Capital Projects)
- Two-Year application for Dublin and Livermore (FY 2025/26 and 2026/27), Pleasanton Application for FY 2025/26


Supporting Documents:

- Financial Audit
- Annual Budget
- Insurance, Business License are still required but will be collected during the agreement execution phase, if grant is awarded.
- System for Award Management (SAM) registration

 - ▶ DUNS Now Unique Entity ID (EID)



Grant Application Process: Dublin

- February 11, 2025: Joint Human Services Commission Meeting – Mandatory for All Applicants
- March 27, 2025: HSC Review and Funding Recommendations
- April 2025: City Council Approval of Funding Allocations
- May 2025: Minor Adjustments to Grant Allocations (if necessary)
- June 2025: Fiscal Year Budget Adopted by the City Council
- July 2025: Agreements Become Effective







Grant Application Process: Livermore

- February 11, 2025: Joint Human Services Commission Meeting – Mandatory for All Applicants
- February 25, 2025 @ 7:00 PM: Human Services Commission will reveal the grant application scoring results
- March 11, 2025 @ 7:00 PM: Human Services Commission will review and approve funding recommendations
- ▶ April 28, 2025 @ 7:00 PM: City Council Meeting to approve the Grant funding recommendations







Grant Application Process: Pleasanton

- February 11, 2025: Joint Human Services Commission Meeting – Mandatory for All Applicants
- March 5, 2025 @ 6:00 pm: Human Services Commission reviews and votes on funding recommendations
- ▶ April 2025 @ 7:00 pm: City Council reviews and approves grant funding recommendations
- June 2025: City Council Meeting reviews and approves City of Pleasanton FY 2025/26 Budget







Political Reform Act

- Section 84308 Pay-to-Play Limits and Prohibitions
 - ▶ SB 1439 took effect on January 1, 2023
 - Prohibits councilmembers from making a decision on your organization's grant application if the councilmember has received a contribution exceeding \$250 from your organization or some of its members in the prior 12 months.
 - California Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) provides more information about this new law:

Grant Applications: Capital Projects

- For Capital Projects: Talk with Staff before Applying!!!
 - Provide a detailed narrative and scope of work.
 - Describe site control.
 - Consider whether relocation is required.
 - Identify the project team.
 - Consider whether a market study been completed to support the proposed project.
 - Explain how the project will comply with federal Davis-Bacon/Fair Labor Standards.
 - Consider the Build America, Buy America (BABA) Act Requirement to utilize American-made construction materials.







Grant Applications: Required Documents

- Required Documents Section:
 - Current Annual Budget for Agency
 - Copy of Last Audit for Agency







Grant Applications: Other Funding Sources

- "Other Funding Sources/Revenue":
 - List the other funding sources and their level of commitment.
 - ▶ Amount Committed This is the funding amount you have already received.
 - Amount Pending You have asked for this amount but have not received formal commitment.
 - ▶ Amount Planned You are planning on making a request for this funding but not submitted the request as of this application.
 - ▶ *Total* Add the three figures listed above, for each line item.

Grant Application: Funding Use Categories

- Funding Uses/Expenses:
 - Please include PROJECT-SPECIFIC Expenses in the following categories:
 - ▶ Personnel Cost Salaries and Benefits
 - Operating Cost Rent, Utilities, Marketing, etc...
 - Administrative Cost Administrative Staff Salaries, Legal Cost, Accounting/Auditing, etc...
 - Capital Cost (Pre-Development) Design, Permits, Engineering, Acquistion Cost
 - Capital Cost (Construction) Construction or Rehabilitation Cost
 - Other (Please Define) Please list any other cost-related to the program

- All applicants may request technical assistance to ensure the application is complete and is not at risk of being rejected.
- Applicants are advised to allow sufficient time to complete the application prior to the deadline.

Grant Applications: Common Errors & Fixes

- Cities may contact your agency throughout the process. Use a "generic" email in case of staffing changes.
- Questions and documents can be easily missed while applying. Read through the application carefully to ensure that you answer all questions and upload each required document.
- Applications will be read by multiple reviewers. Writing must be clear, concise and easy to understand. Explain any acronyms used and avoid the use of jargon.
- To comply with grant requirements, ensure your clients are income-eligible.







Wrap-Up: Final Thoughts

- Start your grant application early.
- Contact staff for questions/technical assistance. (Do not make assumptions in your application.)
- The process for local (City) grant funds is highly competitive and funds are limited.
- Grant program funding allocations are subject to change.
- Agencies are advised to seek additional funding sources.
- Reminder Invoicing and reporting will still be City-specific.


