

Waste and Recycling Regulations and Resources for Businesses

Carryout Bag Requirement

Businesses in Alameda County are prohibited from distributing single-use plastic bags. Businesses may distribute reusable bags for a charge of at least ten cents (itemized on the receipt). <u>Alameda County Waste Management Authority Reusable Bag Ordinance</u>

Food Donations

<u>State law SB1383</u> states food generating businesses must donate surplus edible food. <u>Food recovery organizations</u> help local businesses donate edible food to the local community.

<u>State law</u> protects food generating businesses from civil and criminal liability when donating in good faith.

Waste Disposal and Diversion

SB 1383 and <u>local ordinance</u> states businesses are required to both compost and recycle.

Accepted recyclables in Pleasanton include carboard, paper, glass bottles, plastics #1-7, and cans. For a full list visit Commerical Recycling with Pleasanton Garbage Service. For additional clarity on specific items visit Guide for Reuse, Repair, Recycling, and Safe Disposal.

Compostable items in Pleasanton include food scraps/waste, plant debris, food soiled unlined paper products, and paper towels/napkins. For additional information visit <u>Commercial</u> Food/Green Waste with Pleasanton Garbage <u>Service</u>.
